Sheila Kay Adams is a seventh generation ballad singer, storyteller, author, and claw-hammer banjo player from the mountains of North Carolina. Adams’ devotion to preserving and perpetuating her heritage has earned her a prestigious National Heritage Fellowship from the National Endowment for the Arts, as well as a Brown-Hudson Award from the North Carolina Folklore Society. The list of awards, accolades and recognitions for her contribution to the traditional arts is outstanding. Sheila Kay Adams is truly a national treasure!

The Assembly at Fort Caswell will once again serve as the location for the 2018 Winter Workshop. The retreat center is located on the grounds of the Baptist Assembly at Caswell Beach, on Oak Island, near Southport. The center offers historic facilities with modern amenities, as well as spectacular views of the Atlantic Ocean, Cape Fear River, Bald Head Island, and the historic ruins of a nineteenth century fort. Rooms are shared, two people per room (two double beds and a private bathroom).* Meals include a Friday night dinner, full breakfast and lunch on Saturday, our popular Saturday night supper of Stone Soup, a continental breakfast on Sunday, and a bounty of snacks!

Space is limited to 30 people. **You must pre-register by November 4, 2017, to receive the early registration discount.** Otherwise, the regular price will apply. Please note that once you have registered, no refunds are allowed. If you are unable to attend, you must sell, give away, or forfeit your space at the workshop.
